**Statement Disallowing Claims
formerly SW-33
R.I.G.L. 33-15-23**

This is the form by which a Fiduciary files with the Probate Court a statement disallowing claims against the estate.

- If the Fiduciary wants to disallow any claim, he/she must file this form within 30 days after the expiration of the six months from the first publication of the notice of qualification of the Fiduciary. The Fiduciary must file in the office of the Probate Clerk a statement disallowing such claims filed as he/she intends to contest.
- If a Fiduciary has failed to disallow any claim within the time allotted, he/she may at any time before the distribution of the estate, petition the Court for leave to disallow such claim out of time.
- It is the Fiduciary's responsibility to give notice in writing either personally or by registered or certified mail, to the claimant whose claim is being disallowed.
- Any claim allowed to be filed after 6 months from the first publication of the notice of qualification may be disallowed within the 30 days after having received notice of the filing of said claim.

The Fiduciary or Attorney:

- Presents the form for filing.

The Probate Clerk:

- Notes the disallowance of any claim in the record of the claims filed against the estate.
